A REFLECTION

Reverend Spencer Parks, Menucha Executive Director



I just finished my 19th year as the Executive Director of Menucha. Frankly, it seems as if I arrived just a year or so back. The time has passed quickly, partly because the work has been enjoyable and rewarding. If you had asked me when I started what my long-term goals were for Menucha, I would have had a long and ambitious list. After 19 years, only a few of those goals have come to fruition. That's not a disappointment to me; it just makes me thoughtful.

Probably the most visible goal that's been accomplished is that we now offer our own programs. We started doing that about 16 years ago. That part of what we do has grown and transformed into a major part of who we are at Menucha. The programs we offer in faith, music and the arts have received national attention (some even international attention). There are a number of other accomplishments. To be honest, they are not the ones I had in mind when I started here. But they have been and are important milestones in the life of Menucha. THE COOKTOP - A RECIPE FROM THE MENUCHA KITCHEN

ARROZ CON LECHE (Mexican Rice Pudding)

A simple, delicious recipe
that takes only 30 minutes to make

1 cup rice
4 cups milk
½ of a cinnamon stick

½ cup brown sugar
¼ cup maple syrup



Cook rice with 2 cups of water according to instructions on package.

Add milk, cinnamon stick, brown sugar and maple syrup into a pot. Bring to a simmer while whisking sugar and maple syrup until sugar is dissolved.

Add cooked rice back into the milk pot. Let simmer for 15-20 minutes or until liquid is semi-thick. Stir occasionally so the mixture doesn't stick or burn.

Plate with extra powdered cinnamon on top and enjoy!

FUNDAMENTALS OF GOOD LANDSCAPE PAINTING with Michael Orwick August 14-17, 2023



FireWise is a national program that supports community lead wildfire preparedness by offering a framework for involvement and education and reducing the impacts on people and homes. The threat of the 2017 Eagle Creek fire spurred Corbett residents into action and in early 2023 Corbett was approved as a FireWise community.

Menucha has hosted many community events over the last year in partnership with state and local organizations including Corbett Fire District #14, Oregon State Fire Marshals, Oregon Department of Forestry, US Forest Service and East Multnomah County Soil and Water Conservation District.

MAXIMIZING YOUR GIFT

Setting up a **Recurring Gift** can be a great way to make a larger gift than you might be able make at once. \$25 over a year adds up to \$300, or \$100 totals \$1,200! Sustaining gifts like this secure the day-to-day operations at Menucha and are greatly appreciated.

Matching Gift programs offer a way to sometimes double your gift as well as an employee benefit you don't want to miss out on utilizing. You might also consider asking family members to match your gift. This is a great opportunity for older generations to talk to younger family members about what is important to them and how Menucha has impacted the family.

If you are 72 or older and must take **required minimum distributions from your IRA**, you can transfer up to \$100,000 annually from your IRA directly to Menucha without having to recognize the distribution as income.
