Letter from the Friends of Menucha Foundation

Happy New Year and greetings to all of Menucha's supporters from the Friends of Menucha Foundation. The new year always brings with it a reflection of the past and hopes and anticipation for the future. These hopes are vital for us as individuals and in our communities. This new year also marks a new time for Menucha as an organization, and we are writing to share an important announcement: **the Friends of Menucha Foundation has officially merged with the independent nonprofit Menucha Retreat and Conference Center.**

The Friends of Menucha Foundation was established in 2004, and at that time, **the primary objective was to raise money to support Menucha's distinct mission and programs.** In the early days, we held an annual dinner with auctions to assist in raising money. Over time, the Foundation realized that Menucha's supporters were there to do just that: support Menucha as a community vs. acquire auction items. Hence, we shifted the focus to an annual dinner that promoted community—both at the dinner itself and for Menucha's purpose of building and supporting community. One of the significant benefits of these early efforts was the major projects that updated Wright Hall, including a new roof and substantial kitchen re-do, as well as new windows, paint, and the extended exterior patio. The transformation was visible evidence of the **impact donor support could have on Menucha**.

Menucha has grown and evolved over time, and it became clear that the organizational structure was also ready to evolve and mature as well. **The Friends of Menucha Foundation wholeheartedly supports this evolution.** The merger between FOMF and Menucha Retreat and Conference Center recognizes the advancing of Menucha into its own independent organization with a board that serves in many roles, including fundraising. The merger combines the separate efforts of the Foundation with those of the Menucha board. The result will be reduced duplication of effort and more efficient use of precious volunteer hours. In addition, our long-term planning always included the assumption of responsibility for fundraising by the Menucha board. The merger makes that step official.

Menucha's mission and programs will remain unchanged. It will, however, make fundraising for those programs and mission more efficient. Several current FOMF board members are already on the new board, with the potential for others to join. This, too, has led to a smoother transition during the merger.

The merger was effective 12/31/24, so we begin the new year with hope and anticipation! **As always, we remain so grateful to the many supporters of Menucha, its mission, and its programs.** Thanks to the hard work and generosity of many, this sacred space will continue to be viable for generations to come.

Facilities Update

We had a fantastic year in 2024. A few highlights:

1) Creevey focus:

- New exterior paint to tie in with the rest of the property.
- All new mattresses (with help from donations).
- We began the first steps of a special landscape project, which included planting boxes, pots, lights, and new benches along the walkway from Ballard to Creevey (thanks to donors for these projects).

2) We renovated the McCall house to welcome our new director and her family.

3) Our housekeeping department purchased new furnishings (with the help of donations) to make the break space more relaxing for staff. We also bought new commercial washers and dryers to reduce the cost of renting linens and provide higher-quality linens to guests.

4) Sunrise Daisy path installations have begun assembly.

5) Boy Scouts made more wooden picnic tables for us (we now have 10 tables, which means we can seat 100 people).

We are excited to see where 2025 will take us.

FAQs for Friends of Menucha Merger

How should I make my future donations?

Please make check donations payable to Menucha. Online donations will use the same web portal.

What will happen to my recurring donation to the Friends of Menucha Foundation?

Recurring credit card donations will remain constant as the bank is switched to our system. However, bank bill pay will need to be edited to Menucha instead of Friends of Menucha Foundation.

Will my donations to Menucha still be tax-deductible?

Yes, all donations are still tax-deductible. The Menucha Retreat and Conference Center is a 501(c) (3) charity.

How will this merger impact the use of my donated funds?

Funds will continue to support Menucha's mission, including retreat programs, facility maintenance, and other initiatives.

I accidentally donated to the Friends of Menucha Foundation; what do I do?

No problem! The foundation has merged with Menucha, so they are now one entity. We can accept payments made directly to the Foundation through our Menucha bank accounts.

Will we still have fundraising events?

Yes! Fundraising efforts will remain in-house at Menucha under the development department's direction in partnership with the executive director and the Menucha board.

The Cooktop: A recipe from the Menucha kitchen By Sergio Calvillo-Ruelas, Food Services Manager

Chicken Dumpling Casserole

3/4 cup of celery
3/4 cup of carrots
3/4 cup of onions
2 1/2 tsp of minced garlic
6 tbsp of butter
3/4 cup of flour
2 1/2 tsp of sugar
1/2 tbsp of salt
1 1/2 tbsp of dried basil
1 tsp of pepper
4 1/2 cups of chicken broth
1/2 cups of frozen peas
3 1/4 cups of diced/shredded chicken
8 frozen biscuits



Saute celery, onion, and carrot first for a couple of minutes with butter, then add garlic (garlic is sensitive and will burn quickly). Once tender, add flour and cook for 2 minutes on medium heat to create a roux (be patient). Once the roux is a dirty blonde color, add the chicken broth, sugar, salt, and basil. Bring to a boil and let simmer for 5 minutes. Stir in chicken and peas. In a 9x13 casserole pan coated with oil/butter, place biscuits and ladle in the mixture. Bake in a 350-degree oven for 20-30 minutes or until biscuits are cooked. Serves 8.
